Saint Anne, Mother of the Blessed Virgin Mary

A VERY ANCIENT tradition has preserved for us the names of VERY ANCIENT tradition has Mary's parents, who were, "in their time and historical circumstances, a precious foundational stone in the fulfillment of the salvation of mankind" [Pope St. John Paul II, 26 July 1983]. Through them, the blessing that God promised to Abraham and his descendants has reached us, since we received the Savior through their cooperation. St. John Damascene affirms that we know the blessed couple by their fruits: the Virgin Mary is the resplendent fruit they gave to humanity. Saint Anne conceived her, most pure and immaculate, in her womb. "Oh! most beautiful, most lovable child," the holy Doctor exclaims, "Oh, daughter of Adam and Mother of God! Blessed be the womb that bore you! Blessed be the arms that held you, the lips that had the privilege of kissing voil."

Saints Joachim and Anne had the immense privilege of caring for the Mother of God in their own home. The Lord must have poured out many graces on them throughout this time. St. Teresa of Avila, who used to put the monasteries she founded under the protection of St. Ioseph and St. Anne, argues: "The mercy of God is so great, he will never fail to favor the homes of his glorious grandmother." Jesus descended directly from the maternal side of the faithful parents whose feast we celebrate today....

Pope St. John Paul II teaches that Saints Ioachim and Anne are "a constant source of inspiration in everyday family and social life. Pass on to one another," he exhorts, "from one generation to the next, the entire spiritual legacy of Christian life including prayer." Mary received the treasure of traditions of the House of David, which had been passed on for generations, from her parents at home. Here, Our Lady learned to address her Father God with profound reverence. In this home she learned of the prophecies referring to the coming of the Messiah - the place of his birth.

Mary surely remembered the home of her parents when it came time to set up her own home when Iesus was to be born. The Lord then learned from his mother popular ways of speaking and sayings full of wisdom which he later employed in his preaching. The child Jesus piously heard from her motherly lips the first prayers the Hebrews taught their children as soon as they could speak. What a good teacher Our Lady must have been! With what tenderness did she reflect the richness of her own soul so full of grace. It is likely that we also have received the inestimable gift of Faith and countless good customs from ancestors who have conserved and transmitted them in turn as a treasure. At the same time. we have the gracious duty of maintaining this living patrimony in order to pass it on to others.
